THE PROGRAM

Who should attend?

Modules that make up the units of competency include:

To attain the **I0604NAT Certificate IV in Safety Leadership (WHS) – Construction** qualification, each participant must complete assessment activities and be deemed competent in 12 units of competency.

Those wishing to attain the full qualification will need to attend all 8 days and complete relevant workplace projects.

Credit transfer, national recognition or recognition of prior learning (RPL) can be arranged. Separate fees are chargeable for RPL – please contact our office for details of the process and costs.
